### 4. First Aid Measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	Remove from further exposure. For those providing assistance, avoid exposure to yourself or others. Use adequate respiratory protection. If respiratory irritation, dizziness, nausea, or unconsciousness occurs, seek immediate medical assistance. If breathing has stopped, assist ventilation with a mechanical device or use mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.
<b>Skin Contact</b>	Wash contact areas with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing. Launder

	contaminated clothing before reuse.
<b>Eye contact</b>	Flush thoroughly with water. If irritation occurs, get medical assistance.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Seek immediate medical attention. Do not induce vomiting.
<b>Note to Physician</b>	If ingested, material may be aspirated into the lungs and cause chemical pneumonitis. Treat appropriately.

## 5. Fire Fighting Measures

<b>Appropriate extinguishing media</b>	Alcohol-resistant foam. Carbon dioxide (CO <sub>2</sub> ). Dry chemical.
<b>Inappropriate extinguishing media</b>	High volume water jet.
<b>Special fire hazards</b>	Do not spray on an open flame or any other incandescent material. Keep away from open flames, hot surfaces and sources of ignition.

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

<b>Personal precautions</b>	Avoid contact with spilled material. Warn or evacuate occupants in surrounding and downwind areas if required due to toxicity or flammability of the material.
<b>Environmental precautions</b>	Large Spills: Dike far ahead of liquid spill for later recovery and disposal. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas.
<b>Methods for cleaning up</b>	<p><b>Land Spill:</b> Stop leak if you can do it without risk. Absorb or cover with dry earth, sand or other non-combustible material and transfer to containers. Recover by pumping or with suitable absorbent.</p> <p><b>Water Spill:</b> Stop leak if you can do it without risk. Warn other shipping. Remove from the surface by skimming or with suitable absorbents. Seek the advice of a specialist before using dispersants.</p> <p>Water spill and land spill recommendations are based on the most likely spill scenario for this material; however, geographic conditions, wind, temperature, (and in the case of a water spill) wave and current direction and speed may greatly influence the appropriate action to be taken. ## 7. Handling and Storage

<b>Precautions for safe handling</b>	<p>Avoid contact with skin. Prevent small spills and leakage to avoid slip hazard. Material can accumulate static charges which may cause an electrical spark (ignition source). When the material is handled in bulk, an electrical spark could ignite any flammable vapors from liquids or residues that may be present. Use proper bonding and/or ground procedures. However, bonding and grounds may not eliminate the hazard from static accumulation. Consult local applicable standards for guidance.</p> <p><b>Static Accumulator:</b> This material is a static accumulator. A liquid is typically considered a nonconductive, static accumulator if its conductivity is below 100 pS/m (100x10E-12 Siemens per meter) and is considered a semiconductive static accumulator if its conductivity is below 10,000 pS/m. Whether a liquid is nonconductive or semiconductive, the precautions are the same. A number of factors, for example liquid temperature, presence of contaminants, anti-static additives and filtration can greatly influence the conductivity of a liquid.</p>
<b>Storage precautions</b>	The container choice, for example storage vessel, may affect static accumulation and dissipation. Do not store in open or unlabelled containers.

<b>Engineering controls</b>	Engineering methods to prevent or control exposure are preferred. Use explosion-proof ventilation equipment.

<b>Material Disposal</b>	Product is suitable for burning in an enclosed controlled burner for fuel value or disposal by supervised incineration at very high temperatures to prevent formation of undesirable combustion products.
